

Introduction

This month we will be reading through 3 whole books of the Bible! Below you will find an introduction to each book. Before you begin reading each of these books, spend some time reading through the descriptions below.

Leviticus: Leviticus was written by Moses and it takes place right after the Israelites were delivered from slavery in Egypt. God has just saved His people, and now He is giving them a set of laws to follow. A lot of this book can seem boring, confusing, or meaningless to us today, but there is so much to learn about who God is and what He desires for our lives. As you read Leviticus, remember that Jesus came to fulfill the law which you will be learning about. He perfectly obeyed every single law that you will be reading about and He did this so that He could be the perfect sacrifice for your sins.

Hebrews: We are not sure who the author of Hebrews is, but we can trust that it is truly God's Word spoken to us. This book is all about Jesus and what He has done to save you from your sins and offer you everlasting life! You will learn about who Jesus is, how He fulfilled the law, and what He accomplished in His death and resurrection. The main focus of this book is faith. The author helps define what faith is and talks even more about who we should have faith in.

Hosea: Hosea was a prophet during the reign of four Kings over Judah: Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah. This book is an account of Hosea's life which occurred between 767 and 686 B.C. This book focuses on Israel's disobedience to God. Hosea's relationship with his wife is used to show how God still moves to save His people, even when they disobey Him.

As you go through the reading each day write down your answer to these questions: What did this passage teach you about God? What did it teach you about humanity? Did you see the gospel in this passage? Were there any commands given for how you should live? What is something new you learned through this passage?

Memory Challenge

Question: Are all people, just as they are lost through Adam, saved through Christ?

Answer: No, only those who are elected by God and united to Christ by faith.

Passage: Ephesians 1: 13-14

"In Him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in Him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of His glory."

Each week, come up with one question that you have from that week's reading. Once you have written down that question go and ask it to a parent, grandparent, small group leader, or any other trustworthy adult in your life.
