

Introduction

Whether you've been a Christian for 1 day or 1 decade, you know that the Christian life is not always an easy one. It's full of disappointments, trials, and unexpected opposition. In all the chaos of life, it's vital that we look to scripture for guidance, stability and truth.

This month, we will be reading through some of Paul's letters including 1-2 Thessalonians and 1-2 Timothy. In the first two books, Paul teaches the believers in Thessalonica how to live a life that pleases God and encourages them to persevere despite persecution and not lose hope. The next two books are letters from Paul to his disciple Timothy, teaching him how to minister well and persevere in the gospel despite hardships and false teachings. All of these letters provide us with valuable knowledge and truth to guide us through all of life.

Read each chapter slowly and carefully. Underline, highlight, or mark anything that stands out to you. Remember that these are letters from Paul to a new church and to Timothy.

As you read, take note of what Paul emphasizes. What does he want these believers to know? How can you apply this teaching to your own life? **Keep a journal of at least one takeaway from each day** and any questions you may have.
