

Introduction

This month, we will spend time in the book of Psalms and Job. The psalms are a collection of songs and prayers written around the time of King David. The entire book of Psalms is broken into five smaller books. We will be reading through books 3 (Psalm 73-89) and 4 (Psalm 90-106) this month. Many of the psalms in Book 3 are full of sadness as the writers endure pain, confusion, or suffer. Book 4 is full of joyful psalms as the writer explores the goodness, beauty, power, and love of God. The book of Job explores the journey of a faithful man who loses everything. In the midst of his great loss, Job learns about the importance of trusting in God's power and authority, even when he is facing terrible pain, loss, and suffering.

As you read the Psalms each day, meditate on these questions. What was the author likely feeling as he was writing this? Is the author praising God, pleading to God, praising God's Word, or something different? How can this Psalm help you worship God this week? What did you learn about God through this Psalm?

Memory Challenge

Question: Since we are redeemed by grace alone, through faith alone, where does this faith come from?

Answer: All the gifts we receive from Christ we receive through the Holy Spirit, including faith itself.

Passage: "In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit" Ephesians 1:13

Each week, come up with one question that you have from that week's reading. Once you have written down that question, go and ask it to a parent, grandparent, small group leader, or any other trustworthy adult in your life.
